Long Term Competition Process Flowchart

Key Principles

- What initiates the competition process?
- Defender Criteria
- Challenger Criteria
- Don't take from the Defender until the Challenger is committed to receive
- Handle the Defender
- Handle the Challenger
- Timing

Key Principle: Initiation of Competition Process

- What initiates the competition process?
 - Submission of a Renewal request

Key Principles: Defender Criteria

- Defender Criteria
 - Queued request of type 'Renewal'

Key Principle – Challenger Criteria

- Challenger Criteria, 3 sets
 - Criteria Set 1, Queue Time
 - This option will not be considered going forward
 - Criteria Set 2, Queue Time and Competed Capacity (e.g., like path)
 - Queue Time and Competing Capacity (duration is not considered) – First request in the queue with an earlier queue time than the renewal request needing the same capacity is the challenger.
 - Criteria Set 3, Queue Time, Competed Capacity, Duration
 - Queue Time, Competing Capacity and Duration – First request in the queue with an earlier queue time than the renewal request needing the same capacity with a longer duration is the challenger. (Motion 116)

Key Principle: 'Binding the Challenger'

■ Proposed Definition:

- The Challenger is obligated to take (at a minimum*) the Rollover capacity assigned to them as the result of a successful challenge.

*If an offer is made to the Challenger, it could include more than just the Rollover capacity from a successful challenge depending upon the TSP request assessment process.

■ Proposed Language:

- The capacity available by Rollover as the result of a competition will not be granted by the TP to the Challenger unless the Challenger is obligated to take the Rollover capacity assigned to them.
